From the Peninsula: Take Hwy 101 or Hwy 280 to Hwy 92 East (towards Hayward/San Mateo Bridge). Exit at Mariner's Island Blvd/Edgewater Blvd (1/4 mile after 101 as you head East – get in right lane quickly). Turn right (Northeast) on Mariner's Island Blvd & proceed 1/4 mile. Turn right (East on Fashion Island Blvd & proceed 1/4 mile (past the shopping center). Turn left on Bridgepointe Circle (at Home Depot) and immediately turn right into Hilton Garden Inn, San Mateo.

From the East Bay: Take Hwy 880 to Jackson Street/San Mateo Bridge. Cross the San Mateo Bridge (\$4 toll). Exit at Foster City Blvd to stoplight. Turn left off exit on Chess Drive. Take Chess into Bridgepointe Plaza (Chess becomes Bridgepointe Circle). Hotel will be on the right hand side approximately 1/4 mile into Bridgepointe (after Home Depot).
